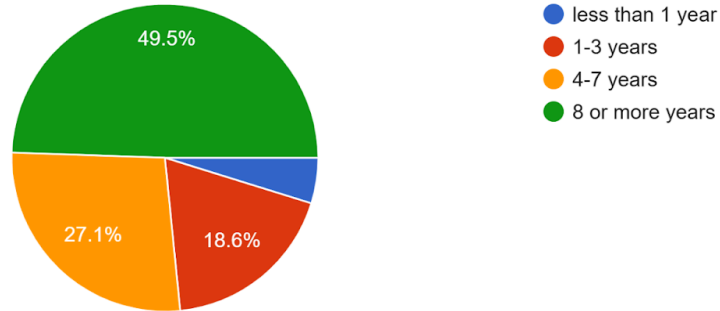


# Student Survey Results

How many years have you been a student at Southwestern?

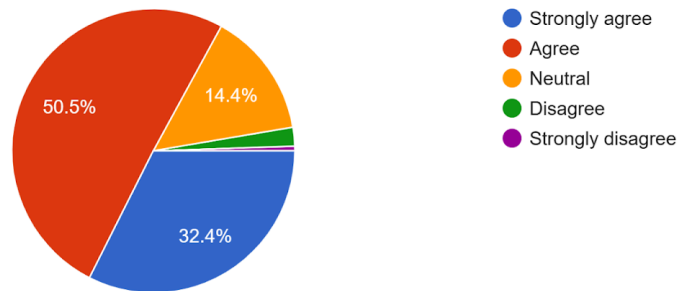
188 responses



Students indicated that the resources provided for learning are appropriate and they are comfortable with the resources.

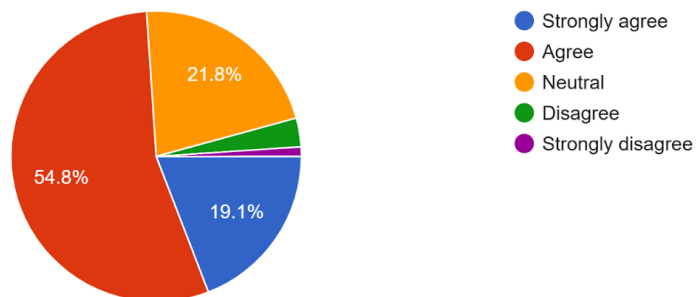
I have access to the technology (computers, internet) I need to complete my schoolwork.

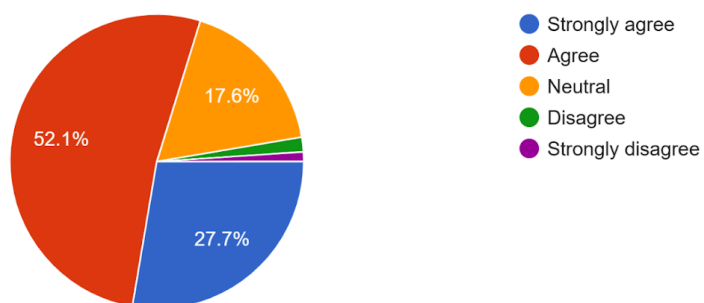
The school provides enough resources (books, materials, support) to help me succeed.

I feel confident using the technology available to me at school.

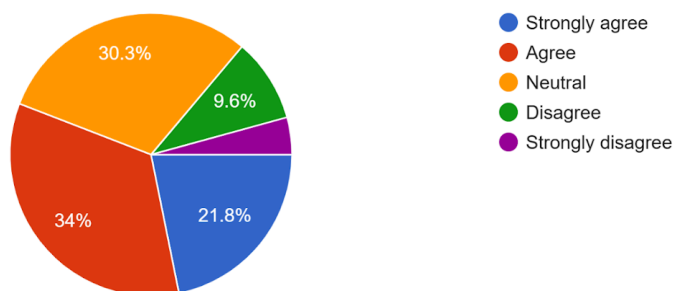

## Positive overall views of extracurriculars

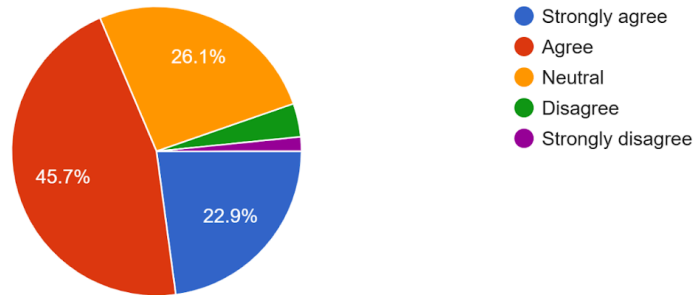
I feel encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities.

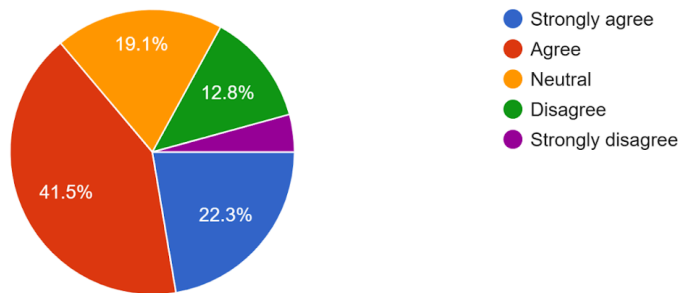
Extracurricular activities help me build new skills or interests.

There are enough extracurricular activities (clubs, sports, arts) for students like me.

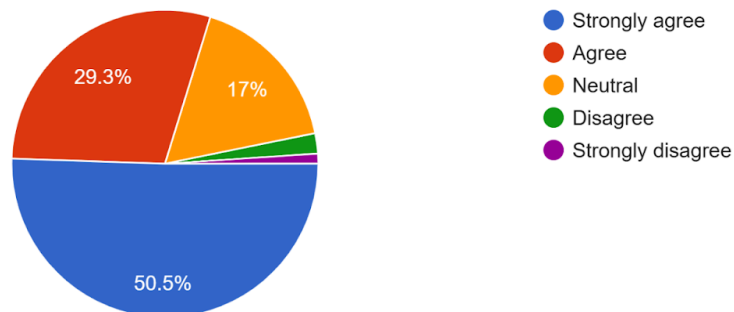

Students feel safe and have friends/classmates that they can talk to.

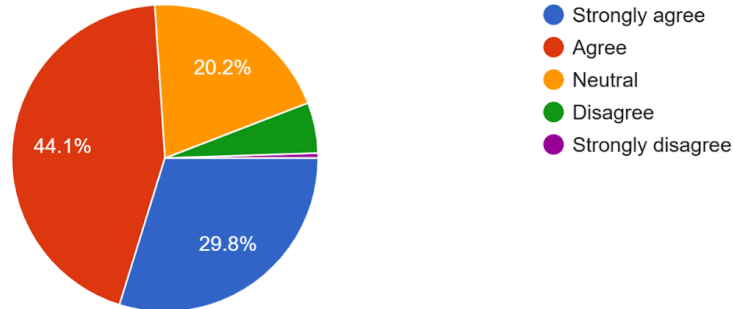
I have a good group of friends or classmates I can talk to at school.

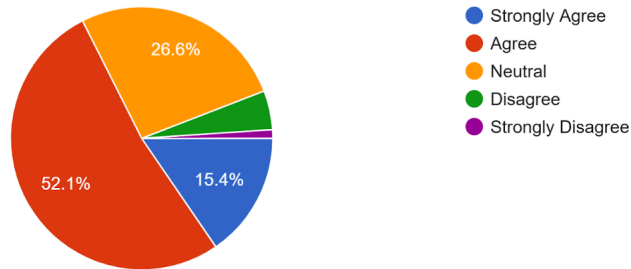

Students seem to feel good about the relationships they have with their teachers.

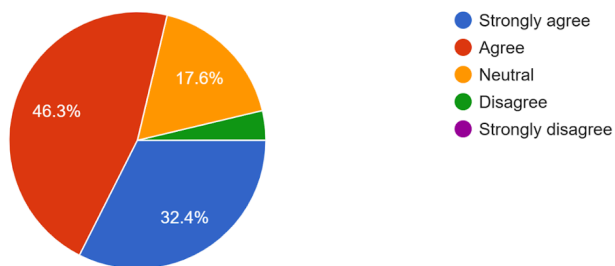
My teachers help me when I don't understand something.

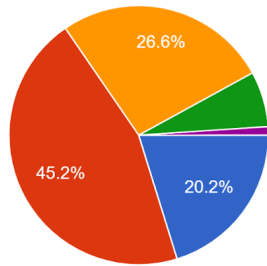
There are adults at school who care about me.

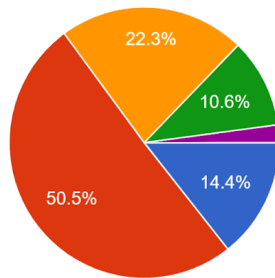

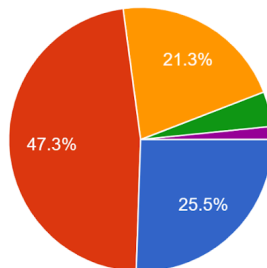

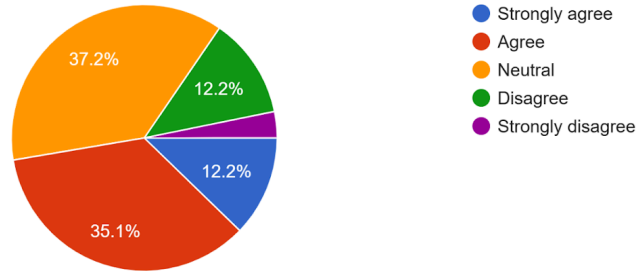

The staff (teachers, counselors, administrators) at school listen to my opinions and concerns.

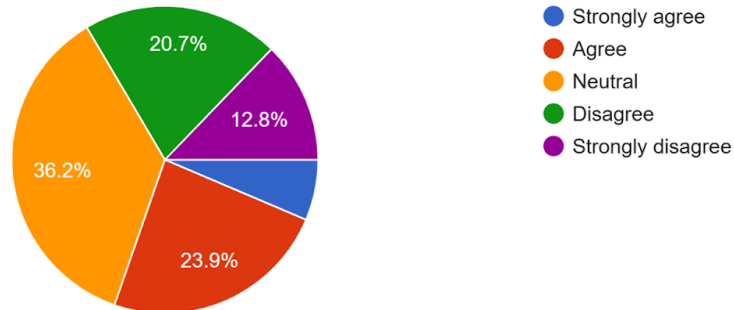

Perhaps reacting to student conflict/bullying is getting in the way of a more positive environment.

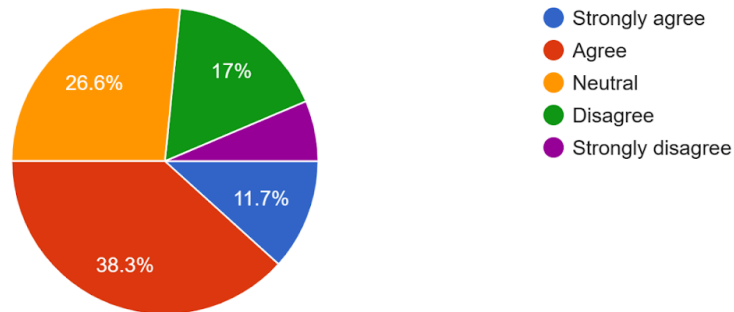
The school does a good job handling bullying or conflicts between students.

The school environment is welcoming and supportive for all students.

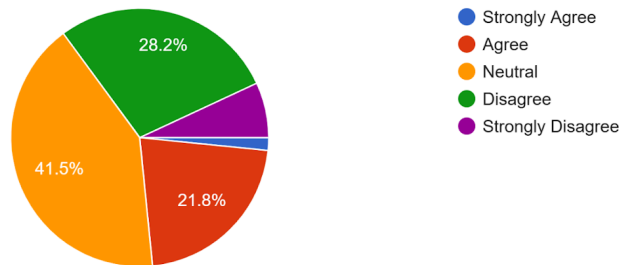

Students have a low opinion of the engagement of lessons and preparation for their futures. Students expressed that the preparation for their futures is important.

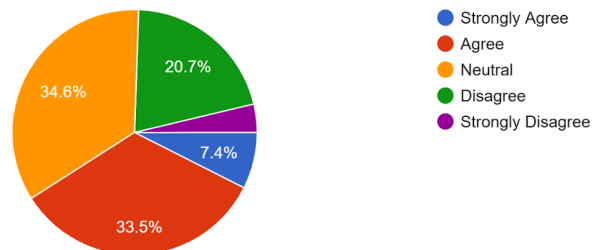
The lessons in my classes are interesting and engaging.

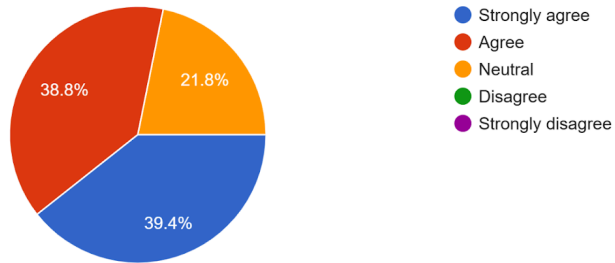


I feel that my classes are preparing me for the future (college, jobs, life skills).

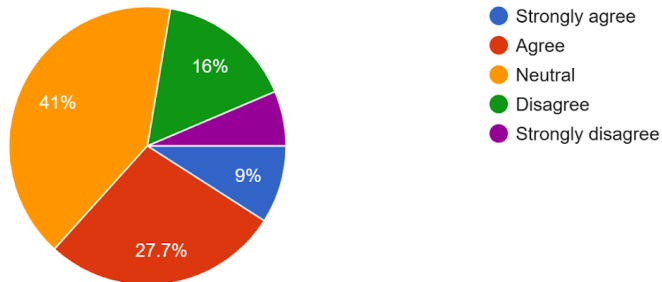


The school should focus more on preparing students for life after high school (college, work, etc.).

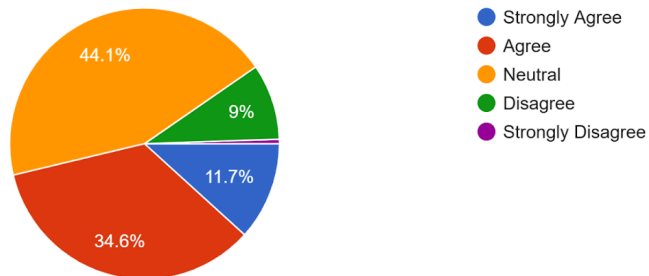


These statements have a large “neutral response.”

## Extended Response Analysis

Based on the student feedback, the 5 most common reasons students like their school are:

1. Friends: The presence of strong friendships and positive peer relationships is clearly a top reason for student satisfaction.
2. Teachers: Students value teachers who are supportive, helpful, and create a positive learning environment.
3. Small School Environment: The small size of the school fosters a sense of community, belonging, and personalized attention.
4. Sports and Extracurricular Activities: Participation in sports and other extracurriculars provides students with opportunities for enjoyment, connection, and personal growth.
5. Community/People: Students appreciate the overall positive and welcoming atmosphere created by the people within the school community.

Based on the student feedback, the 5 most common items that students would like to see changed are:

1. Bullying and Harassment: This is the most frequent concern, with students highlighting its prevalence and the perceived inadequacy of the school's response.
2. Teacher Quality and Practices: Students express a range of concerns, including favoritism, unengaging lessons, and lack of respect
3. College and Career Preparation: Students want more guidance and resources to help them prepare for life after high school, including college applications, scholarships, and career exploration.
4. School Environment and Cleanliness: Students indicated seeing cockroaches, along with general concerns about cleanliness and the need for school updates.
5. Food and Lunch: Complaints about the school lunch, with students desiring better quality, variety, and specific menu items.
